RESOLUTION 2020-1

The City Council has approved a water rate increase of .10 cents per 1,000 gallons. An average family uses about 10,000 gallons per month which will cost \$1.00 per month more. The change will be effective with the July billing (June 21 to July 20, 2020). This small rate increase (the first since 2015) will allow the City to better cover the costs of operations and maintenance of the system. The base fee for outside water assessments will increase by 10%.

Adair Village Land Use Development Code Section 6.401:

Any person who keeps chickens in the City of Adair Village shall apply for and obtain an Annual Backyard Chicken Permit prior to acquiring the chickens.
