ADAIR RURAL FIRE AND RESCUE THANKS THE CONFEDERATED TRIBES OF SILETZ INDIANS

In the fall of 2021, Adair Rural Fire and Rescue (ARF&R) applied for a 50/50 matching from the Siletz Tribal Charitable Contribution Fund to replace our fleet of aging automated external defibrillators (AEDs). The application was reviewed and we were granted the funding.

Receipt of the funding for this project allowed ARF&R to update our AEDs to state of the art devices and have identical equipment to the other providers in the surrounding service areas. This alone is a significant advancement in our ability to seamlessly interface with other agencies during an emergency.

While the population of our service area is approximately 3000 people, this equipment will effectively be used to serve thousands more. Our district has a

section of state highway 99W that is traveled by thousands of individuals each week placing these people in potential need of our services. Additionally, our department responds to state wide wildland fire emergencies where the AED on the responding units supports the medical needs of people affected by these incidents.

Adair Village Land Use Development Code Section 6.401:

Any person who keeps chickens in the City of Adair Village shall apply for and obtain an Annual Backyard Chicken Permit prior to acquiring the chickens.
