## ADAIR VILLAGE EMERGENCY VOLUNTEER CORPS

Adair Village is seeking to enlarge its volunteer base to be as ready as possible for potential emergencies, disasters, as well as non-emergency needs. With a trained cadre of volunteers, Adair Village will be capable of safely running emergency disaster response operations, and community emergency readiness training and engagement. Adair Village Emergency Volunteers can be activated by the City Council as outlined in the Emergency Management Plan available on our website. We have a variety of volunteer positions as listed below:

- Mass Care & Sheltering
- Call Center
- Evacuation Centers
- Reunification of Loved Ones
- Damage Assessment Surveys
- Debris Location Assessment
- Evacuation Surveys
- Pet Sheltering
- Points of Distribution
- Emergency Operations Center support
- Community Emergency Response Team (CERT). Training to become a CERT member is initially online and then skill testing/refining takes places monthly on the third Wednesdays of most months.

We also highly recommend the Be 2 Weeks Ready (B2WR) program available online from the Benton County Sheriff's Department. The "Be 2 Weeks Ready" program was developed by the Oregon Department of Emergency Management (ODEM) as part of their mission to empower people to be as prepared as possible in an emergency. Being 2 Weeks Ready means having an emergency plan and enough supplies for you and everyone in your household to survive for at least two weeks following a disaster. The program is designed to help you start from where you are at and build your self-reliance and community preparedness step-by-step over eight user-friendly lessons. ## MEDICATION DISPOSAL

Adair Village is participating in the MED-Project to help residents dispose of unwanted medications safely. Residents can pick up mail back envelopes at City Hall during regular office hours. Please review the information below prior to mailing unwanted medications.

**ACCEPTED:** Medications in any dosage form, except for those identified as Not Accepted, in their original container or sealed bag.

Please remove any identifying labels on medication bottles.

**NOT ACCEPTED:** Herbal remedies, vitamins, supplements, other personal care products, emptied medical devices, batteries, mercury-containing thermometers, sharps, illicit drugs, pet pesticide products, animal medicines, and biologics.

## REPUBLIC SERVICES RECYCLING UPDATE

As of July 1, 2025, all Oregonians will be able to put the same expanded list of items in their curbside recycling cart and trust that the recyclable materials will be recycled. Republic Services is proud to be a partner in expanding recycling in Oregon.

**You'll be able to add the below items to your curbside recycling cart! All items must be empty, clean and dry of food, debris and liquid residue:**

- Molded pulp packaging (e.g. egg cartons, but not food service ware or flower pots)
- Polycoated cartons, aseptic cartons (e.g. milk cartons and boxes of vegetable stock or broth)
- Steel cans, including empty and dry paint cans
- Nursery (plant) packaging: #2 and #5 plastic only
- Scrap metal less than 10 pounds in weight and 18 inches in length; excluding sharp items and tangles, like wire and chains
- Plastic tubs: #1, #2 and #5 plastic only
- Plastic bottles that are 2 inches by 2 inches or bigger; #1, #2 or #5 plastics only; caps OK if screwed on-  
Plastic buckets, pails and other bulky #5 plastic storage containers



## GRASS AND WEEDS REMINDER

As of April 1st, you must keep all grass and weeds under ten inches in length. We also suggest that you consider applying a non-toxic weed and feed product to your lawns to help minimize the growth of dandelions which tend to grow faster than grass.
