## HAPPY HOLIDAYS AND LOOKING FORWARD TO 2026

I hope everyone had a wonderful Thanksgiving, and I want to wish all of you a joyful and peaceful Christmas season. As we look forward to the new year, I'm excited to share that 2026 is shaping up to be one of the busiest—and most productive—years we've had in a long time. Thanks to several major grant awards, we'll be moving forward on multiple projects that will benefit our community for decades to come.

### Major Projects in the New Year

#### \$500,000 Oregon Parks & Recreation Grant – New Park Amenities

We are thrilled to have received a major park grant from Oregon Parks and Recreation totaling \$500,000. This funding will allow the city to construct a new pavilion, a walking path, and a public restroom in the open space between City Hall and the Barracks on William R. Carr. This will be a tremendous addition for community gatherings and recreation.

#### \$4 Million Wastewater Lagoon Expansion Grant

The City has been awarded \$4 million in lottery bond dollars to expand our wastewater lagoon capacity. This project will support current and future residential development, ensuring we can continue to grow responsibly. This is a significant and much-needed infrastructure investment.

#### Backup Generators for Lift Stations

We have also received grant funding for backup generators at our wastewater lift stations. These generators will be installed in 2026, improving system reliability and emergency preparedness.

#### ODOT Grant for Street Overlay – \$250,000

Adair Village has secured a \$250,000 grant from ODOT to complete an overlay on Willamette and Laurel. This is a long-needed roadway improvement that will enhance safety and ride quality in a busy part of town.

#### Barracks Building & Interpretive Center

We continue to work with ALH on the completion of the Barracks Building, including the creation of an interpretive center highlighting the history of Adair Village. This will be an important resource for honoring our past and educating future generations.

With all of these exciting projects, 2026 will be a busy and transformative year for our community. Thank you for your ongoing support and partnership as we continue working to improve Adair Village.
