

However, please be mindful that the area is predominately funded by hunting and fishing licenses. As such, the area is also open to hunting in the fall and winter. You may encounter hunters and hunting dogs off leash. New and old residents are encouraged to take full advantage of all the incredible and diverse outdoor activities in and around our town.

STORMWATER EDUCATION

Do you know where your waste goes when you flush the toilet or unplug the drain? All that wastewater flows to the City's wastewater treatment plant where it is treated and disinfected before being pumped to the Willamette River. While our City's wastewater treatment plant is designed to treat sewage, it is not designed to treat the water for medicine, pesticides, oils, paints, and other liquids that can sometimes get poured down the drain. Please remember to properly dispose of these hazardous wastes so they do not end up in the river that we all enjoy during the warm weather!
