## WHAT'S IN YOUR BAG?

A wallet is not a bad place to start when building an emergency “go” bag. You should have some cash available for emergencies in your go bag. But what else should be packed and ready to go in the precious few minutes you might have if you have to evacuate your home? The list below comes from the ready.gov website (which also has lots of other great resources to help you with emergency planning).

- Water—at least a gallon per person, per day
- Non-perishable food (such as dried fruit, peanut butter, or energy bars)
- First aid kit
- Prescription medicines
- Extra batteries or an alternative power source
- Matches in a waterproof container
- Toothbrush, toothpaste, soap
- Paper plates, plastic cups and utensils, paper towels
- Battery-powered or hand-cranked radio
- Sleeping bag or warm blanket for each person
- Flashlights
- Whistle to signal for help
- Can opener (manual)
- Local maps
- Pet and service animal supplies
- Baby supplies (formula, diapers, etc.)
- Extra pair of eyeglasses



Your kit will depend on your own needs. Take time to think through any unique needs you or your family members might have. Here is another great idea: emergency supplies make an excellent holiday gift for your relatives in other households. This is a practical gift that you can feel really great about giving even though you hope it will never be needed. So, what are you waiting for? Get going on your go bags today. The Budget Committee for the City of Adair Village will hold its first meeting on Tuesday, April 16<sup>th</sup>, 2024, at 6:00 PM at City Hall, 6030 William R. Carr Ave. The purpose of this meeting is to present the budget and the budget message and to take comments and questions from the public. The public will also have a chance to speak on behalf of State Revenue Sharing.

This budget was prepared on the same basis of accounting that was used during the preceding year. This budget is for the annual period of July 1, 2024, through June 30, 2025.
