CA Foster reported that water rates had not been updated since 2012. This resolution will not change the basic meter rate (now \$48.00 per month for City residents), but it will increase the charge per 1,000 gallons from \$4.25 to \$4.65 (a 9.4% increase) in two steps. To \$4.45 on July 1, 2015 and to \$4.65 on January 1, 2016. This increase will allow the City to meet rising costs in operation of the water plant and continue work necessary to complete the new reservoirs on Voss Hill.	Council reviewed resolution and made a number of editing recommendations. This Resolution with corrections will be on the agenda for next month's City Council meeting.
13. Attachment L – Resolution 2015-#04 – DEQ Loan Agreement for WWFP Bench Testing (Agenda Item 7b).
